



I'd like to invest in a seriously warm jacket for the winter. Can you advise? If, once again, we're going to experience the kind of polar temperatures that had British Gas rubbing its hands with glee last year, then sheepskin and shearling are the cosiest and most hard-wearing skins to choose. It's also a big trend for the season.

Fortunately, styles have moved on since Del Boy graced our TV screens in his grubby number.

For the best modern shapes, look at the new autumn/winter collection from Burberry. Known for its luxurious coats and outerwear, its natural shearling jackets with brown leather straps on the sleeves or the long, funnel-necked aviator coats in military grey look sharp over dark tailoring or low-key knitwear. The downside, however, is the price. High-end skins like these are eye-wateringly expensive with the

shorter Biggles styles starting at £2,495. For an alternative investment, try the double-breasted military greatcoat for £995. With smaller amounts of shearling around the collar, it's still expensive but built to last. And if that kind of cash still hurts your budget, Topman Design

have short military jackets, hooded parkas and longer length coats in khaki with high shearling-lined collars for many hundreds of pounds less. 3
